#### QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS.

#### DIGHA WATERWORKS.

- e 263. Babu GUR SAHAY LAL: (a) Is it a fact that a reduction in the consumption of coal and other maintenance charges of the Digha waterworks pumping station, Patna, has been made since the appointment of the Assistant Mechanical Engineer in the Public Health Department, Engineering Branch?
- (b) If so, will Government be pleased to state the amounts of saving on this work as well as on other similar works in the province? Why was the consumption of coal more previous to this and who was responsible for it?

## Mr. H. E. HORSFIELD: (a) Yes.

(b) There was a saving of Rs. 10,191 at Digha in 1926. The saving effected in other waterworks in the province cannot be ascertained until the annual report of the Superintending Engineer, Public Health Department, Bihar and Orissa, for the year 1926-27 is received.

The reasons for the reduction in consumption of coal are:-

- (i) Coal was purchased through the Coal Controller prior to April 1926; subsequently it has been purchased by the Public Health Engineering Department, which maintains the waterworks, after tests of its calorific value and a fuel more suitable to the plant has been obtained.
- (ii) The pumping plant has been brought into a more efficient condition.

# ANNOUNCEMENT WITH REGARD TO ANSWERS TO THE PENDING QUESTIONS.

The Hon'ble Mr. E. L. L. HAMMOND: Sir, out of 345 questions which had been received by Government we have been in a position to arswer not less than 309 questions leaving 36 unanswered. Of this 36, four of them are here on which I have just been able to-day to take His Excellency's order for answer. The reason for the remaining unanswered questions is simple. Where we had to make enquiries from the Board of Revenue, Commissioners and District Magistrates we only had to wait for their replies. With utmost endeavour we have not been able to get the replies in time to have them printed or roneoed for presentation to-day and answers to these questions will be laid on the table at the next session of the Council.
