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(b) (i) The contributions made by the Government of India in G. M. F. is 50 per cent of the cost of the Schemes in most cases. No contribution is received towards capital cost.

(ii) The year for which the information is required is not clear from the question. During the year 1947 the total expenditure on G. M. F. Schemes was Rs. 22,86,058 and the share of the contribution payable by the Government of India was Rs. 11,43,029. A statement showing their utilisation is laid on the table.

(a) whether it is a fact that the officers of the Agricultural Department who have been deputed for studies at the Sabour Agricultural College for the session 1947—50 have represented their case to the Government for granting them cost of leaving allowance ;

(b) whether it is a fact that the Principal certified that these students can not maintain with the emoluments that do they get ;

(c) whether Government are aware that these officers have got their families which they have to support ;

(d) if the answer to clause (a) be in the affirmative what orders have been passed on the representation ?

DEPUTATION OF THE OFFICERS OF THE AGRICULTURAL DEPARTMENT, BIHAR  
TO AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, SABOUR

**5. Shri RASH BIHARI LAL :** Will the Hon'ble Minister in charge of the Development Department be pleased to state—

(a) whether it is a fact that the officers of the Agricultural Department Bihar, are deputed to the Agricultural College, Sabour, for prosecution of studies in the degree course ;

(b) whether it is a fact that the officers who have been deputed for the sessions 1945—48 and 1946—49 do get half average pay and study allowance amounting to Rs. 40 per month as well as the cost of living allowance ;

(c) whether it is a fact that the officers deputed for the session 1947—50 are denied the advantage of getting cost of living allowance though the officers deputed for the previous session are still now continuing to get this allowance ;

(d) if the answer to clause (c) be in the affirmative the reasons, if any, for this ?

**The Hon'ble Dr. SAIYID MAHMUD :** (a) The answer is in the affirmative. Only six Government servants are sent for such training every year.

(b) The answer is in the affirmative.

(c) The answer is in the affirmative.

(d) The study allowance of Rs. 40 per month besides half average pay sanctioned by Government for the two batches of the sessions 1945—48 and 1946—49 was intended to include the cost of living allowance. The Director of Agriculture's office misunderstood the same and consequently the cost of living allowance was paid to the first two batches in addition to study allowance and half average pay. Last year the mistake was detected and it was ordered that the payment of cost of living allowance was not regular as it was done against the order of Government. It was therefore suggested that the students should refund the money unless justification is given for not doing so. The Director of Agriculture was informed accordingly but he and the Principal of the College gave facts and figures justifying that cost of living allowance should be paid to these
