Suspension of the payment of collective fines.

*230. Mr. JAGDISH NARAYAN SINHA: Will the Hon'ble Prime Mintster be pleased to state-

(a) the reasons for suspending the payment of collective fines;

The Hon'ble the SPEAKER: The report of the office is that the copy of the Bill was circulated on the 4th March. May I know whether it is a fact that any hon'ble member received a copy of the Bill on the 4th March or a copy of the Bill has been in his hands for seven days? Is there any hon'ble member who got the printed copy of the Bill as early as seven days ago?

Dr. PURNA CHANDRA MITRA: I did not ge. it

Mr. JAMUNA PRASHAD SINGH : We do not rem mber.

The Hon'ble the SPEAKER: Is there any hon'ble member who got the copy of the Bill as early as seven days !

Mr. RAMESHWAR PRASAD SINHA: We on this side of the House got the Bill only a few days ago. We do not quite remember if we actually got it a week ago.

The Hon'ble the SPEAKER: Is the hon ble member speaking for himself or for all the hon'ble members?

Mr. RAMESHWAR PRASAD SINHA: I am speaking for myself and also for a few more hon'ble members.

The Hon'ble the SPEAKER: There is a difference of opinion as to the exact period for which the copy of the Bill was in the hands of the bon'ble members.

The Hon'ble Pandit BINODANAND JHA: Sir this is a single clause Bill and it is not very urgent from the point of view of administration and if hon'ble members want time to study it Government will not stand in their way.

DISCUSSION ON THE AGENDA BEFORE THE ASSEMBLY.

Mr. HAMESHWAR PRASAD SINHA: Before we disperse to day, we would like to know what the agenda for tomorrow is. I suppose we have got discussions on the voting of demands. But it is curious that we have not yet received a copy of the cut motions that are to be discussed tomorrow.

The Hen'ble the SPEAKER: The copy will be circulated today.
It has not been received by my office from the press.

Mr. MURLI MANOHAR PRASAD: May I invite your attention to the fact that in the past copies of cut motions have always been circulated several days in advance? It is for the first time that up till now we have not been supplied copies, although the discussions start tomorrow.

The Hon'ble the SPEAKER: The difficulty would be only with regard to cut motions fixed for tomorrow. If copies are received from the press today, they will be circulated today.

Mr. MURLI MANOHAR PRASAD! I would like you, Sir, to consider if it is proper that the circulation of papers should be so inordinately dolayed. Even with digard to cut motions fixed for tomorrow, members would certainly require time to consider the items, study the budget and then come prepared to say what they have to say.

The Mon'ble the SPEAKER: It is not the fault of the office. Office does not receive the full co-specation from the press.

Mr. MURLI MANOHAR PRASAD: The press is exactly what it was last year or since the Bihar Assembly was created.

The Hon'ble the SPEAKER: That is a point on which I cannot say anything. We have been rominding the press to hurry up.

I am also told just now that there is some change in the administration of the press. They do not work beyond the fixed hours these days.

An Hon'ble Member: It can be rongoed

The Hon ble the SPEAKER: The notices of cut motions, as they have been received from the hou'ble members, have been reneedd. The groups of these cut motions and their placing in the order of business allotting them days have not been done. This thing has been sent to As soon as copies are received from the press, they will be circulated.

Mr.: MURLI MANOHAR PRASAD : Supposing Sir, you are not getting the copies from the press tolday, are we going to start discussions

The Hon'ble the SPEAKER: If things come to such a pass, 1 would try to roneo the copies of cut motions in my office and circulate them to hon ble members. If the press do not co-operate with us and copies are not received in time, I would get them reneed and circulated by this evening. The time table for the voting of demands cannot be altered.
