Proceedings of the Bihar Legislative Assembly assembled under the provisions of the Government of India Act, 1935.

The Assembly met in the Assembly Chamber at Patna on Thursday the 13th February, 1947° at 11:30 a.m., the Hon'ble the Speaker, Mr. Vin, dhyeshvwari Prasada Varma, in the Chair.

SAORT NOTICE QUESTION AND ANSWER. * ABRESTS OF CONGRESS SOCIALIST PARTY WORKERS AT JEARIA.

- 1. Mr. PHULAN PRASAD VERMA; Will the Hon'ble Prime Minister be pleased to state—
- (a) why Mukutdhani Singh and some others, Congress Socialist Party workers, have been accested in Jharia;
- (b) what orders are they supposed to have violated and what exactly is the offence they are supposed to have committed;
- (c) were notices served on them asking them to desist from certain course of action before they were arrested;
- (d) are Government aware that several Congress Socialist Workers who were organising the Socialist Conference have been arrested although they had nothing to do with the Kasur Colliery strike;
- (c) is the Prime Minister aware that several Congress Socialist. Workers were accepted in Monghyr although nothing incriminating was found in their possession when scarches were made;
- (f) is there any drive against the Congress Socialists in this Province if so, why?

The Hon'bis Mr. ANUGRAH NARAYAN SINHA: Sir, with your permission I propose to make a statement which will cover the replies to all the questions which the honsble member has just put.

The leaders of Congress Socialist Party in the coalfields were invited to see the Add:tional Deputy Commissioner on the 7th morning. Messre-Matukdhari Singh, Mundrika Singh and Basawan Singh asw the Additional Deputy Commissioner in the afternoon. They were aware of the formation of the Board of Conciliation, but said they would not accept the Board as their representative was not on the Board and they would continue the strikes.

As the strikes had become illegal and these leaders had avowed their intention to continue the strikes, arrests were made the next morning under section 151 of the Criminal Procedure Code read with Rule 81A. Defence of India Rules. Thus / were arrested on the 8th morning. 8 on the 9th morning, on the 10th mid-day and on the 12th afternoon.

The Hon ble Mr. SRI KRISHNA SINHA: (a) 278 cases against 2,205 Hindus have been instituted in North Bihar. 2,366 cases have been instituted against 13,827 Hindus in South Bihar.

(b) All possible precautions have been taken to see that innocent persons are not implicated. The evidence against each person is carefully examined.

Mr. MAMESH PRASAD SINHA: Are all the 13,827 Hindus accused were collected from the reports in the F. I. R., or as a result of Police investigation?

The Honble Mr. KRISHNA BALLABH SAHAY: Some were mentioned in the F. I. R., and the rest were collected as a result of Police investigation.

Mr. MANESH PRASAD SINHA: Arising out of (b), is it known to Government that several men above 100 years of age who were incapable on account of infirmity, have been implicated in these cases?

The Hon'ble Mr. KRISHNA BALLABH [SAHAY: Jovernment are not a ware.

Mr. MAHESH PRASAD SINHA: My submission is that several persons who are incapable of standing even were made accused.

The Horbis Mr. KRISHNA BALLABH SAHAY: Sir, I have slready answered the question. It may be true, but we have seen in jails infirm people having committed rapes and so it is not improbable that people over the age of one hundred years may have committed any crime.

Mr. MAHESH PRASAD SINHA: Was any enquiry made considering the infirmity and old age of these persons ?

The Hon ble Mr. KRISHNA BALLABH SAHAY: 1 want potice of this question.
