EXPENSE IN LAURIYA CASE.

NOTICE UNDER SECTION 144, CRIMINAL PROCEDURE CODE, ON PEOPLE OF GHORASOHAN AND OF PATILAR AND LAGUNAHA.

215. Has the attention of the Government been drawn to the statements in the local press regarding the service of notices under section 144, Criminal Procedure Code, (a) forbidding the holding of bazar in Ghorasohan locality and (b) forbidding villages Patilar and Lagunaha cattle to graze on *parti* (waste) land of villages Chowtarwa Parsawni?
