EMIGRATION OF ABLE-BODIED PEOPLE OF AUL FROM THE
CUTTACK DISTRICT.

131. Babu BIRABAR NARAYAN, CHANDRA DHIR, NARENDRA : Is it a fact that since the year 1920 the majority of the able-bodied people of Aul in the Cuttack district have emigrated to distant parts in search of livelihood?

Mr. J. R. DAIN : There is reason to believe that a large number of able-bodied people have emigrated in search of employment to Calcutta and elsewhere from the portion of the Aul estate which was affected by the high floods of 1920.

HINDU HONORARY MAGISTRATES IN THE HAJIPUR BENCH OF

132. Chaudhuri RAGHUNANDAN PRASHAD SINHA :

Is it a fact that there is not a single Hindu honorary magistrate in the Hajipur bench of the Muzaffarpur district?

Mr. H. L. L. ALLANSON : No. There are two Hindu honorary magistrates on the Hajipur bench.

SUPPLY OF GOVERNMENT PUBLICATIONS TO THE LOCAL PAPERS
AND THE PAPERS IN CALCUTTA.

133. Babu DEVAKI PRASHAD SINHA : (a) Is it a fact that certain Government publications have either appeared in, or been noticed by, certain daily papers of Calcutta, before such publications have been officially sent to the local papers?

(b) Do certain papers in Calcutta receive Government publications before they are supplied to the local papers?

(c) If the answer to (a) be in the affirmative and the answer to (b) be in the negative, have Government made any inquiries about the cause of such publications being received by Calcutta papers before they are officially issued to the press by the Government? Do Government propose to take steps for preventing such things in future?

Mr. G. RAINY: A statement is laid on the table giving the number (year by year) of police officers and men dismissed for bribery and extortion. Government do not consider it desirable in the public interest to give the names of these officers and men.
