Proceedings of the Bihar Legislative Assembly assembled under the provisions of the Government of India Act, 1935.

The Assemly met in the Assemly Chamber at Ranchi on Friday, the 12th September, 1947, at 11 a.m., the Hon'ble the Speaker, Mr. Vindhyeshwari Prasada Varma, in the Chair.

SHORT NOTICE QUESTION AND ANSWER.

SUBSTITUTION OF COMPLETE RATIONING IN MUZAFFARPUR, ARRAH AND RANGHI TOWNS BY PARTIAL RATIONING.

- 1. Mr. MAHESH PRASHAD SINHA: Will Government be pleased to state—
- (a) if they have decided to substitute complete rationing in Muzaffarpur, Arrah and Ranchi towns by partial rationing;
- (b) if answer to (a) be in the affirmative, the date on which they took this decision and the reasons for the same;
- (c) if they are carrying on their procurement policy through monopoly system in the province;
- (d) Will Government be pleased to make statement on present food situation in the province?

The Hon'ble PANDIT BINODANAND JHA: (a) The answer is in the affirmative.

- (b) Government took the decision on the 16th August, 1947. That decision was taken because they found that they could not keep up statutory rationing and local sources of supply were available.
- (c) Monopoly procurement is in force in Manbhum Sadr subdivision and parts of Purnea in the province only.
- (d) The present food situation, although of great concern is not one as to cause serious anxiety or likelihood of famine or even famine conditions. The last kharif crop in the province was very good one and during the year so far we have received more assistance from the Government of India in the matter of import than in the preceding four years. The term crops, summer rice and also the Bhadai rice, maize and Marua are now almost ready and in some cases have already been harvested and these along with anticipated help from the Government of India will help to tide over the critical period until the next kharif crop of which the prospect so far appear to be fair.

- (iii) the aforesaid attitude of the officers which is most often resented to by Kamadars and as a result of which they are victimised;
- (b) whether ft is a fact that few cases of this nature have also in the past been brought to the notice of the Director of Agriculture and the Deputy Director of Agriculture but all in vain;
- (c) if answers to clauses (a) (i) to (iii) be in the affirmative, what action Government are going to take in the matter?

The Hon'ble Dr. SAIYID MAHMUD: () The answer is in the affirmative.

- (b) Three compleints of this nature were received by the Director of Agriculture. One of these was investigated by the Deputy Director of Agriculture, Headquarters and the allegations were found to be untrue. The other two cases have been sent to Danuty Director of Agriculture concerned for report and their reports are awaited.
- (c) Government are considering the recommendation of Director of Agriculture that the posts of Kamdars should be made permanent and pensionable and that they should be provided with uniforms both in the summer and winter

BIHAR AGRICULTURAL GRADUATES TRAINED AT CAWNPORE AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE.

- 12. Sardar HARIHAR SINGH: Will the Hon'ble Minister in charge of the Development be pleased to state—
- (a) the number of Bihar Agricultural graduates from Cawnpore Government Agricultural College trained on the stipend of the Sihar Government and the number of such graduates employed in the Department or elsewhere in different capacities on grades of salaries;
- (b) whether Government have noticed any marked difference between the products of Cawnpore College and Sabour College of Bihar, in so far as the services rendered by them is concerned; if so, what;
- (c) whether it is a fact that the four students of Government Agricultural College, Cawnpore, have resented their employment by the Government of Bihar as Agricultural Overseers on a monthly salary of Rs. 52;
- (d) if the answer to clause (c) be in the affirmative, will Government be pleased to state their intentions with regard to the representations of these students?

The Hon'ble Dr. SAIYID MAHMUD: (a) A statement showing the number of Bihar Agricultural graduates from the Cawupore Agricultural College, trained on the stipend of the Bihar Government and showing also how they are employed and their scale of pay is laid on the table.

(b) The Bihar Agricultural College was started in 1945 and the students are expected to come out of the College in 1948. Hence no comparison can be made at present.

(c) Yes, they have submitted representations about it.
(d) The scale of pay of these Agricultural graduates will be governed by the decision of the Pay Revision Committee.

1947 Stipendiaries who have come out successful this year have not yet been appointed against vacancies. Steps are being taken to absorb them against the exisiting vacancies.

Mr. JAMUNA PRASHAD SINGH: Are Government aware that the graduates in Agriculture from Cawnpur College or any other college do not enjoy equal status in the matter of service in this province?

The Hon'ble Dr. SAIYID MAHMUD : Government are painfully aware of it.

Mr. JAMUNA PRASHAD SINGH: Do Government think of taking steps and issuing instructions that these graduates of Agriculture may enjoy equal status in Executive Service and other services of Government?

The Hon'ble Dr. SAIYID MAHMUD: As regards pay, the question is before the Pay Revision Committee. As regards other things, no representation from them has been made.

Mr. JAMUNA PRASHAD SINGH: Representations may not be made, but how is it that the graduates in Agriculture cannot apply for Executive Service as other graduates?

The Hon'ble Dr. SAIYID MATMUD: I am not aware of any such restriction.

Mr. PRABHUNATH SINGH: Will Government be pleased to state that a representation on behalf of them by some members of the Assembly was sent to the Government members that their cases should be given special consideration for the appointment of Grow More Food Officers?

The Hon'ble the SPEKER: I am unable to understand and how this supplementary arises on the main question. The question of Grow More Food Officars is not under consideration.

Mr. PRABHUNATH SINHA: As the Hon'ble Minister has just now said that no representation was made on behalf of them may I know from Government that when advertisement for the appointment of Grow More Food Officers was made a representation on behalf of them was sent by some members of the Assembly for considering their cases for the appointment of Grow More Food Officers particularly because it relates to the department for which they are meant?

The Hon'ble Dr. SAIYID MAHMUD: I am unable to understand how this question does arise. But I shall answer all the same. The appointment of Grow More Food Officers is made through the recommendation of the Public Service Commission and I think they did consider the representation of the Agricultural graduates when recommending names.

Mr. MURLI MANOHAR PRASAD: Do Government agree that a starting salary of Rs. 50 a month for the gradutes of the Agricultural College is absolutely niggardly?

The Hon'ble Dr. SAIYID MAHMUD: I have already answered this. Government are painfully aware of it.

MR. MURLI MANOHAR PRASAD: Is it a fact that the number of applications received from year to year for admission in the Cawnpur Agricultural College has been declining steadily?

The Hon'ble Dr. SAIYID MAHMUD: Yes.
