- Mr. BINODANAND JHA: (a) There is no dispensary hetween Muzaffarpur and Saraiya on the Rewa road but there is one Government Ayurvedic Malaria Centre at Panapur which is meeting the demand of the locality.

- Mr. BINODANAND JHA: It is an Ayurvedic dispensary but it is not fitted with surgical arrangements.
- Mr. SHIVANANDAN RAM: What is the lot of patients requiring operation?
- Mr. BINODANAND JHA: Under the latest method of Ayurvedic training a surgical wing can be constructed there and in the meantime patients requiring surgical aid are being sent to Muzaffarpur.
