- (b) what was exactly the area affected; how many subdivisions of the Province were affected by the riots;
- (c) the chronological history (in brief) of the riots as it developed from place to place;
  - (d) at how many places was firing resorted to;
  - (e) how many persons were killed as a result of the firing?

The Hon'ble Mr. SRI KRISHNA SINHA: (a) 5,558 persons are reported to have been killed in the riots.

- (b) and (c) A statement containing such information, as is available. is placed on the table.
- (d) and (e) Firing was resorted to at 82 places (on 89 occasions) and about 393 persons are reported to have been killed as a result of the
