NUMBER AND RATE OF TRAVELLING ALLOWANCE OF INSPECTING
MAULAVIS.

243. Maulavi SAIYID MUHAMMAD HUSAIN: Will the Government be pleased to state—

(a) the total number of inspecting *Maulavis* in the province;

(b) the names of the districts in which inspecting *Maulavis* are working at present;

(c) the rate of travelling allowance allowed to inspecting *Maulavis* per day;

(d) how are the duties of an inspecting *Maulavi* performed in those districts, if any, in which there is no inspecting *Maulavi* at present?

Mr. B. A. COLLINS: (a) 17, including one temporary inspecting *Maulavi*.

(b) Patna (2), Gaya (2), Shahabad (1), Monghyr (2),* Bhagalpur (1), Purnea (1), Muzaffarpur (2), Saran (1), Darbhanga (3), Champaran (1), Cuttack (1).

(c) Re. 1-2-0 subject to a monthly maximum of Rs. 27 and an annual maximum of Rs. 275.

(d) Every Muhammadan sub-inspector of schools visits *Maktabas* in his circle as a matter of course. In districts containing no inspecting *Maulavi* the Hindu sub-inspectors of schools visit *Maktabas* merely to ascertain that they are working regularly, that the teacher and students are present, and so on. The real inspection is made by the special inspecting officer for Muhammadan education.
